## The Message of Christmas

The Apostle Paul declared, "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons (Galatians 4:4-5). The Apostle wrote these words during a very difficult time in the church. Jewish legalists, who held to the Law of Moses, had infiltrated the church at Galatia. These Jewish teachers were trying to force Christian to undergo circumcision and come under the authority of the law.

First, we note Paul's words "when the fullness of time had come." The word "fullness" (πλήρωμα) refers to the totality of time or a period of completion. It means that the time of waiting for the Messiah was complete. The world stage was now set for

the arrival of the long awaited King-Deliverer. God had orchestrated events leading up to this point in history: (1) Rome had built new road systems which made travel easy. (2) The Roman world was at peace. (3) Greek was the universal language. (4) A census was order by Caesar Augustus requiring people to return to their place of birth to be registered (Luke 2:1). This meant that Joseph and Mary had

to travel to Bethlehem. This was also the fulfillment of Micah 5:2 "But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days." There were simply too many events surrounding the birth of Christ to call it a coincidence. It was clearly the hand of God!

# The Message of Christmas (continued from page 1)

It was at this critical moment in history that God “sent forth his Son.” The words “sent forth” (ἐξαπέστειλεν) literally means to send out a message. The message God sent was his Son, Jesus Christ the redeemer of mankind. This Messiah was “born of a woman.” That is, he was fully human with all the characteristics a baby. But, he was also “born under the law.” This is important, not only for the church at Galatia, but for us. The word “born” (γίνομαι) refers to the specific circumstances surrounding his birth. The word “under” (ὑπὸ) meant under the control of the

law with an obligation to fulfill the requirements of the law.

So, which “law” are we talking about here? We are talking about the Law of Moses (cf. Galatians 4:21-27). Therefore, the Messiah had an obligation to fulfill the entire Law of Moses. In short, Christ had to live the law perfectly. But, why did he have to do this? Well, the Messiah had to “redeem those who were under the law” (Galatians 4:5). The Greek word for “redeem” (ἐξαγοράζω) means to deliver and pay a price for something. In this case, it refers to paying the price for those who sinned against the Law of Moses and God.

The ultimate goal of all this is that “we might receive adoption as sons” (Galatians 4:5). Here is the heartbeat of the gospel. This “adoption” (υιοθεσία) means that God formally and legally declares those who were not his children to be his children. Notice, this adoption is not something that is earned by human effort, but is “received” by faith. This is the true message of Christmas! Yes, that is right. God sent his Son into this world and he went to the Cross to pay for our sins in order to adopt us into his family!

## Recipe Corner—Evan’s Winning Chili

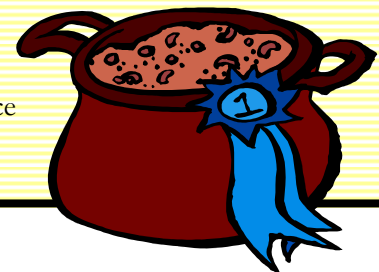

When last year’s chili cook-off came around, I decided it would be the perfect time to try out a recipe. I had no idea that simply trying a chili recipe from a cookbook themed on a TV series I like would lead to me winning the chili cook-off not once, but twice. So, now that you know the story behind it, here’s the actual recipe:

### Ingredients:

- 2 lbs ground beef
- 2 tsp cumin
- 1 tsp ground oregano
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 Tbsp ground garlic
- 4 Tbsp chili pepper
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper
- 2 (15oz) cans of tomato sauce
- 1 (10oz) can of Rotel
- 2 cans of chili beans

### Preparation:

- 1) Brown ground beef with onions & garlic
- 2) Add remaining ingredients into a large pot and cook for 4 hours on medium heat, stirring often.

# Women's Christmas Party

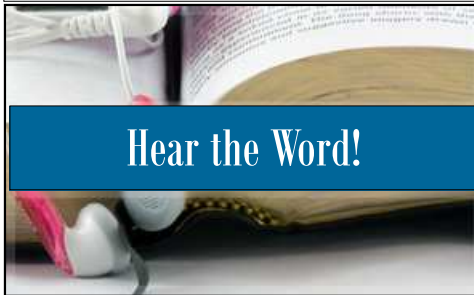
